“I was a hockey coach that couldn’t skate,” is one of the most representative statements Clark Giller ever shared about himself, always willing to fill a gap in supporting others or getting the job done. Lovingly known as “Dad” to several, “Grandpa” to many and “Giller” to most others that crossed his path, he was a man of many talents, a witty humor, great integrity, commitment, and deep love and admiration for his favorite dance partner and bride of almost 69 years, Geraldine (Mendyk).

With a degree from Michigan State University and after spending 35 years at Green Bay Packaging, most recently managing the folding carton division, Clark took pride in the years he spent providing for his family, engaging with his community, and owning a share or two of the Green Bay Packers. Additionally, Clark took great respect and humility in his time serving with Brothers in Arms in the United States Army during the Korean War and being a dad and grandpa to other service members as well.

In more recent years, Clark lived retirement to the fullest. While in Green Bay for the summers, Clark could often be found chatting (and distracting) new

and old friends waiting for their dinners at Julie's Park Cafe in Door County and sharing wisdom with others in his work with the JayCees and volunteering at the hospital. In Florida, he managed the Senior Pool Leagues, manned the grill for the Senior Baseball games and supported several dances, community events, and functions at the Community Center.

Clark Giller was preceded in death by many loved ones including his parents, Gustave and Mollie Giller, a beloved infant son, Bruce Giller, his sister Marlene (Matt, deceased) Bleadow, and many close friends from Green Bay, WI and Leesburg, FL. Clark took great joy in retelling memories of these dear ones.

Daily, Clark and Gerry modeled how to love each other throughout life's ups and downs. They made friends with strangers and never missed a chance to tell others how special they were to them.

Clark loved to dance to Polkas and sing "You Are My Sunshine" to family and was surrounded by music and loved ones in his home as he took his last breaths. He is survived by his sister Carol (Rufus, deceased) Wilkinson, Jacqueline (Willie, deceased) Gray, Georgiana (Tony) Scaringe and children; Mary (Wilbert) Hooten, Julie Hermann, Charles (Kathy) Giller, and Dorothy Giller (Kris Evans). Clark will be lovingly cherished and remembered by his 6 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren. "Grandpa" stories will be told for many years to come.
