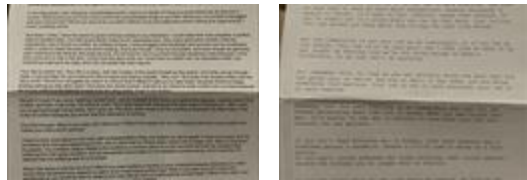

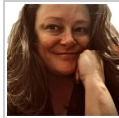
Those kids loved Derrick so much and they loved him.
