



## Earl Schweger

July 6, 1919 - September 20, 2007

Earl B . Schweger. Died at age 88. September 20, 2007 at Bellin Memorial Hospital in Green Bay, Wis. He was born July 6, 1919 in Eland, Wis. to Mr. and Mrs. A.B. Schweger. Earl graduated from Wittenberg High School and then pursued his education at Layton School of Art, Milwaukee. His career in advertising art commenced at Gimbels display in Milwaukee. He then taught art at Clintonville High School and was with the advertising department at Four Wheel Drive Corporation until 1955 when he opened his own advertising studio in Green Bay. He created the North Central Airlines “flying Goose” logo. In 1963 he joined the Atomic Energy Commission in Albuquerque, N.M.. being responsible for their house publication. Two years later the family moved to Dallas. Earl retired in 1995 as President of the Alderman Agency in Dallas after 40 years with the corporation. The family then returned to Green Bay. Earl married and is survived by his wife of 67 years, Carolyn Hansen Schweger, daughter of Dr. and Mrs. F.W. Hansen in Wittenberg. Born to them were three sons, Charles ( Barbara ), John and Paul. There are two grand-daughters, Culley ( Steven ) Bell, Maija ( Neera )Prakash and five Precious great- grandchildren, Salix, Linnea and Violet Bell, and Indra and Nayan Prakash. Other survivors are brother-in-law, Edward Hansen; God- Child, Paul Mitchell; niece Mary Keller; nephew Robert Hansen.
