James W. Redemann, 75, Allouez, Wi, passed away peacefully on July 31, 2022, at St. Vincent Hospital. James was born the son of the late Hilmar and Marie (Cain) Redemann on February 23, 1937 in Ripon, Wi. James graduated from Ripon High School in 1955. He earned his B.S. Degree from Wi.
