She took pride in her work and creations. Her artistic ability was seen by her willingness to

help with parties, decorations and milestone celebrations. She loved to be outside and enjoyed nature. During her more youthful and healthy years she loved fishing, country music concerts, Door County trips, grill outs, going up north and camping.

Mom is survived by her three children , 2 son in laws, and a daughter in law. Heather (Mark) Delveaux, Heidi (Bart) Baeb, and Matthew (Stephanie) Schneider. She also has 8 grandchildren she held dear to her heart, Anna Baeb, McKayla Baeb, Brayden Delveaux, Preston Delveaux, Shayne Delveaux, Isabelle Schneider, Cordelia Baeb and Ivy Schneider.
