Richard L. Englebert, 93, Green Bay passed away on Sunday, Feb. 20, 2011, at Ledgeview Nursing Home. Richard was born on the family farm in Southern Door County to the late Frank and Victoria (Bero) Englebert on April 28th 1917. As a youth the family moved to De Pere where Richard continued on the family farm until WW II.
