On January 29, surrounded by her beloved family, Sharon Rose Biebel Hartmann (80) passed away peacefully. Born to Marvil Toonen and Norbert Biebel on October 4, 1942, Sharon grew up in Green Bay, graduated from St. Joseph Academy in 1961, and St. Norbert College in 1965. Sharon met George F. Hartmann at St. Norbert College and they married on June 19, 1965. Sharon always said her wedding day was the luckiest day of her life. Sharon and George moved around the country while having their family and settled back in Green Bay in 1974 to be close to Sharon's parents.

Sharon was dedicated to service and many community and church activities. Organizations include: Service League, Paul's Pantry, Meatloaf Ladies at the New Community Shelter, Miracle League, Ladies of Lambeau, Childhood Safety, Nursing Home and Hospital Eucharistic Minister, and St. Norbert Student Teacher Supervisor. Sharon taught at Resurrection Catholic School for 20 years. She looked at life with the glass half full, never half empty.

Sharon was devoted to her family with her children and grandchildren as her highest priority. She hosted all the important events and focused on every last detail to be sure each family member felt special.

Sharon is survived by her husband of 57 years, George.
