Steven "Steve" A. Carlson, 72, Green Bay passed away on Thursday, November 28, 2024. Steve was born on April 24, 1952 in Green Bay the son of the now late Arthur and Ruth (Christensen) Carlson. Steve was a graduate of Green Bay East High School with the class of 1970. He then obtained his Bachelor of Arts degree from St. Norbert College, completed his masters degree from the University of Cincinnati, Conservatory of Music and went on to work on his doctorate at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. Steve taught at Southern Door High School, De Pere East High School and Mannheim Middle School in Illinois. He was recently named the volunteer of the Month for GBAPS in November, volunteering at Webster Elementary School. The love for the stage and theater and music was his life.

Steve is survived by two sisters: Debra (Charles) Faison and Connie (Jon) Burggren. He is further survived by nieces and nephew, Danielle Faison, Keegan (Amy) Burggren, Lydia (Lucas Meier) Faison and Britta (Michael) Graham, other relatives and friends.

“ Steve was singular in my experience, and he leaves a void as big as a canyon in my life. He was so talented. So special. So intelligent. So kind. So wickedly acerbic. So generous. He grabbed a hold of my imagination when I was just 15 and really, really illuminated the world of music and theatre for me; He gifted me with a love of music and theatre that have been the cornerstone of a lifelong joy.

We started out as teacher and student at Southern Door High school, but after my graduation, we became good, good friends. In reflecting over the years, it seems to me Steve's life had taken on a circular motion; He spent his life in the service of his family, his students, and his art. He was able to retire with his full teacher's pension for a job well done, had influenced thousands of children. He went back to Mannheim and visited his friends at the school and completed a circle there and he volunteered at his childhood elementary school and closed another circle of service there.
